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*A word from Pastor Amy....***Easter Is Over—Now What?**

Have you ever prepared for something over many months, like a wedding or graduation party or specific sports season or special project, then when the day arrives, and the moment is over, you stop and wonder, “Now what?”

I have known several couples that were so focused on the big wedding day that they struggled to later make the marriage work. I can remember the letdown at the end of marching band season or the week after the high school musical, when I actually had to ride the bus home from school and wondered how to suddenly fill my hours.

Sometimes, I will confess, I feel this way after Christmas or Easter. The flowers have been taken home. The special hymns have been sung. The church has gathered for worship. After weeks of preparing during Advent or Lent, once the day of celebration is over, I sometimes think to myself, “Now what?”

In reality, I know what comes after Easter. Here at First UMC, our Easter celebration continues with the Easter party and children’s program, followed by end of the year celebrations, followed by Annual Conference. Summer planning kicks into high gear after Easter.

But then I think deeper than our programming. I think about our discipleship. Easter is the celebration of the foundation of our faith- Christ is risen from the dead! Hope is alive! But how does such good news impact our lives? How does Easter make a difference in our hearts and in our minds? Are we even open to what is next, how to live in response to such good news of resurrection?

This is when I give thanks for the Easter Season of the church year. The 50 days between Easter and Pentecost remind us that the “now what” after Easter is a call to respond to Jesus’ love with faith, to respond to Jesus’ forgiveness with repentance, to respond to Jesus’ resurrection with hope. The Easter Season is a call to learn how to respond to the good news of Easter with our commitment to be disciples of Jesus.

This Easter Season, I invite you on a journey that responds to the question, “now what?” May we learn to live in daily response to the good news that Christ is risen. May we grow deeper in believing in and listening to Jesus so that we can be sent to love in Jesus’ name. May we continue to live and to share the good news of Easter, so that it is more than a one-day celebration in our church and in our lives. Christ is risen! Alleluia! May we respond in faith.

Or, David Finney will lead an offering of this same material on Tuesday at 12:00 noon at The Gathering, in Middletown. Springboro people are invited to join us at The Gathering for this study. Lastly, we will offer this via Facebook, in the manner in which we offered the study on Simon Peter. See me, David Finney for information on this.

As we move through May, we will be moving closer to West Ohio Annual Conference, this year beginning on June 2. As a Certified Lay Minister, I will attend this event in Lakeside, with voting privilege. We still invite interested people in claiming District At Large Laity Delegate status and credential. Claim the district credential and vote on all of the issues and candidates at Lakeside. See me or Pastor Amy for more information on becoming a District laity delegate.

Jacque Pickett has become my personal angel by her work at Otterbein Avalon Springboro.

Jacque is bringing God's love to the elders who reside at Otterbein. Jacque has gone far beyond my own modest level of involvement. But more can be done. Please see Jacque or myself on how to become plugged in as a volunteer with our local elders at Otterbein.

Bishop Palmer has invited us to come together as The West Ohio Conference in the study of **Galatians: Gospel of Grace** over the weeks of the Easter season. Space is available for all who choose to come. Bring your Bible. Bring your heart and mind. Bring your love of Jesus.

Paul wrote his letter to the church at Galatia during a time of great tension. Leaders in the church were suggesting that believers must become Jewish before they could become followers of Christ. Paul responds with intense emotion, stressing that the very gospel is at stake in this decision. He urges the Galatians to trust that they are justified by faith in Christ rather than the works of the law. He encourages them to accept the freedom that grace offers, to be guided by the Holy Spirit to live in unity as they “bear one another’s burdens” and share the fruit of the Spirit.

As we study Galatians, Paul will challenge us to consider how the gift of grace through faith in Jesus Christ sets us free from the burden of sin and the law, and free for unity across differences, bearing the fruit of love in Spirit-filled community. After all, in the end, we are a family. You are member. Come and grow with your brothers and sisters. There is a place for you.


